Flipping the Iceberg: Seeing, Understanding, and Managing Risk – An Evidence-Producing Standard

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Statewide Cohort Adoption

KHC, in partnership with state organizations, is facilitating a series of cohort hospitals to train and achieve CJCP qualification, beginning in 2025. The data and evidence gathered from this pilot will provide guidance for a larger roll-out across Kansas and ultimately become the standard used in hospitals across the state.

KHC is confident that this investment will lead to measurable improvements in patient safety metrics, reduce costly medical errors, result in fewer claims, and create a paradigm shift in achieving high reliability in healthcare; setting a precedent for nationwide adoption.

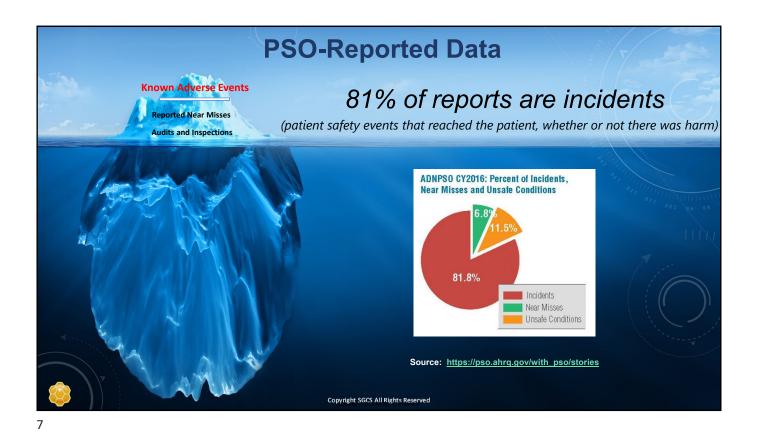


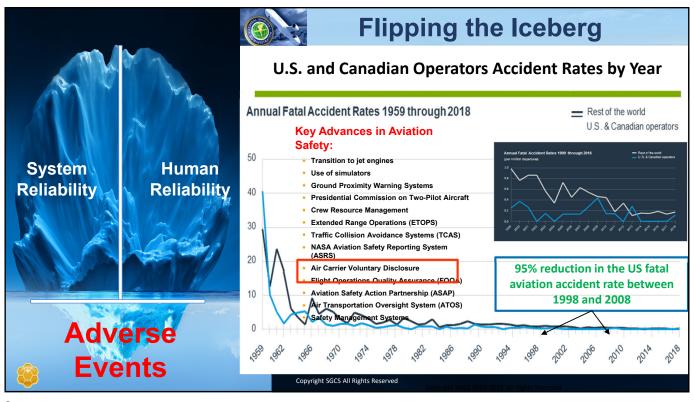
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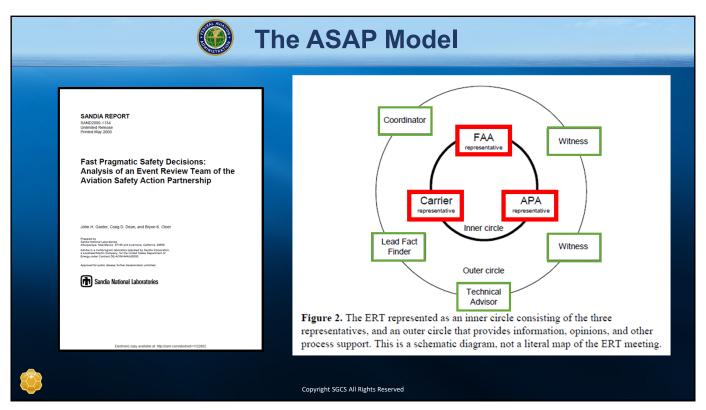


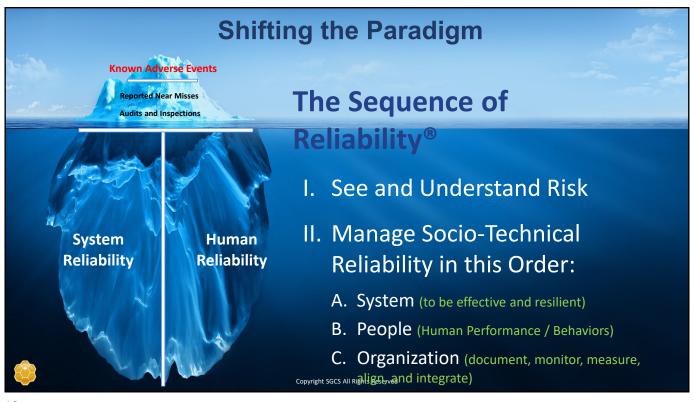


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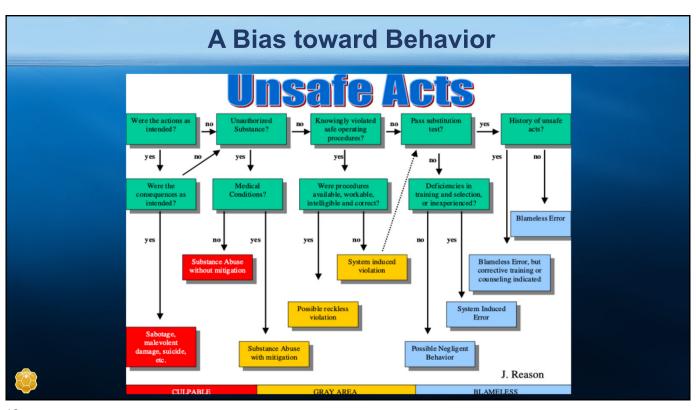
History of Just Culture

- In 1997, Professor James Reason first coined the term "just culture" in his book, Managing the Risk of Organizational Accidents
- The just culture philosophy became an algorithm focused on employee behavior



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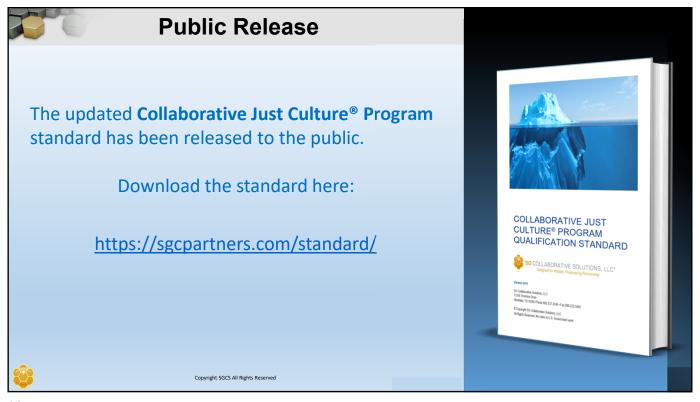
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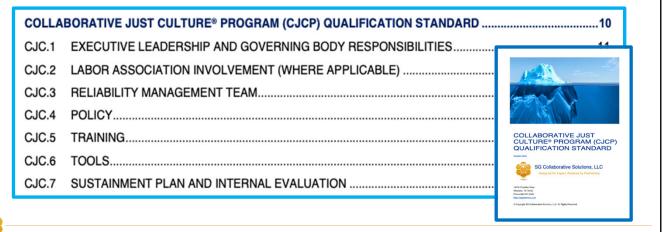






Required Elements of a CJC Program

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Independent Biennial Audits



Initial Audit

• Examines the program infrastructure (Commitment, RMT, policies, training, tools, sustainment & measurement plan)

Requalification Audits (every 2 years)

Examine the organization's documenting, monitoring, and measuring



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CJC.7 Sustainment Plan and Internal Evaluation



- Sustainment Plan: CJCP sustainment plan must be documented
- **Internal Evaluation:** Specific process for conducting ongoing measurements, an annual internal evaluation and reporting the results
- Periodic Review Meetings with Executive Leadership
- Annual Reports to the Governing Body

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Collaborative Management of Risk



Assess *how* the organization sees, understands, and manages risk, including responses to all findings and recommendations

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Perception of Culture Survey



Assess the perception of the organizational culture and workplace justice through a survey of different work groups.

Work Group Perspectives to Obtain
Senior Executives, Vice-Presidents
Directors, Managers, Supervisors
Frontline Staff
Quality, Safety, Risk, Performance Improvement Departments

- Survey should be confidential and voluntary but include a representative sampling from each department.
- Survey questions should be reviewed by the Reliability Management Team
- Results should be documented by department.

- Strategic planning and organizational policy;
- Culture of safety and learning health systems;
- Accountability and transparency; and
- Patient and family engagement.



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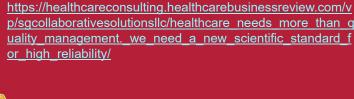
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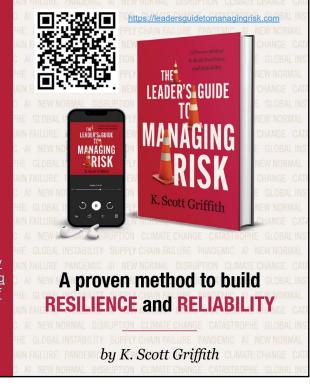
